1. Chair's Remarks

The Chair welcomed members and guests to the last Committee meeting of the governance year, and asked the telephone participants to introduce themselves.

She congratulated Professor Alen Hadzovic and Mr. Dean Carcone for winning the Assistant Professor/Lecturer and Masters Level- Graduate Research Awards, which were presented at the Celebration of Distinguished Services on May 31st. Dr. Curtis Cole, Registrar & Assistant Dean (Enrolment Management), also noted that his colleague, Dr. Naureen Nizam, won the Principal's Emerging Leader Award.

2. Assessors' Reports

The Chair invited Professor William Gough, Interim Vice-Principal, Academic and Dean, to present his report.

Professor Gough reported that the UTSC Academic Plan was endorsed in principle by the UTSC Campus Council on May 26th and presented to the Academic Board for information on May 30th. He added that execution of over 60 action items within the Plan had already begun.

A member commented on the financial implications for creating faculties at UTSC, and Professor Gough explained that further analysis would be required by the Chief Administrative Officer's Office.

In response to a question regarding interest in faculty status, Professor Gough reported that the Department of Management had expressed interest in becoming a Faculty in part to maintain a competitive edge amongst other institutions. He also mentioned that many postsecondary institutions who offered similar programs were being identified as schools of business.

A member commented that it would be advantageous from an advancement perspective to also consider naming the Faculty, if status were to be granted. The Chair thanked Professor Gough for his report.

3. Strategic Topic: The Registrarial Role in the Implementation of the UTSC Academic Plan

The Chair invited Dr. Cole and Dr. Nizam to outline the role of the Registrar's Office in the implementation of the UTSC Academic Plan. Their presentation¹ included the following key points:

- The Department was collaborating with the Dean's Office and the academic departments to provide data to facilitate the management of enrolment and to enhance the timing of progress toward degree completion;
- A Data Request Ticket System had been developed to allow academic departments to request information supporting program enrolment planning, which would be generated by data analysts in the Registrar's Office;
- An enhanced enrolment reporting tool using data visualization software (i.e. IBM cubes and Tableau) to illustrate students in a program, year of study and grade point averages (GPA) was to be implemented;
- The creation of course selection sheets for first year students was in progress; and
- The Registrar's Office was continuing to work with the Development and Alumni Relations Office (DARO) to collect and record information on graduates on the behalf of the academic departments.

A member commented that the course selection sheets for first-year students would be helpful in upper years as well, and Dr. Cole explained that the Registrar's Office would be happy to work with any department that expressed an interest.

A member asked why over enrolment in a program would be challenging, and Dr. Cole explained that the academic departments only have resources and capacity based on their faculty complement.

A member commented on the rate of progression through a degree and time to graduation and expressed caution on putting pressure on students to graduate. Professor Gough explained that the information was not intended to be used to pressure students, but to help support them to complete their degree.

A member commented on the over subscription of several programs. Dr. Cole explained that work was being done to improve the conversion model because assumptions in the model were based on historical, not real-time, data.

4. Annual Report: Vice-Principal, Research

The Chair invited Professor Heinz-Bernhard (Bernie) Kraatz, Vice-Principal, Research, to present the Annual Report to the Council. His presentation² included the following key points:

- In 2013-2014, UTSC published over 600 scholarly journal articles, books and chapters;
- Scholars at UTSC had collaborated internationally with academics from several institutions including: Massachusetts Institute for Technology (MIT), University of Michigan, and University of Oxford;
- Research funding increased from \$9M to over \$12 M between 2011-12 to 2015-16;
- Tri- Council funding (i.e. NSERC- Natural Sciences and Engineering Research Council, SSHRC- Social Sciences and Humanities Research Council, and CIHR-Canadian Institute for Health Research) has steadily increased since 2010;
- The Office of the Vice-Principal, Research had been involved in the administrative oversight of 504 external grant applications and provided enhanced support to approximately 204 applications;
- \$779,091 was allocated to UTSC scholars through the Research Competitiveness Fund;
- In 2015-16, UTSC received \$52,917 in funding for research events targeted at students, staff, faculty and community members; and
- UTSC continued to award Faculty Research Awards and Student Research Awards Grants;

A member asked what the projected trends were for tri-council funding in 2016-17, and Professor Kraatz reported that he was optimistic that the positive trend would continue by supporting larger grant applications.

In response to a question regarding the number of publications generated by UTSC, Professor Kraatz reported that the statistics included publications from teaching stream faculty.

A member asked whether teaching stream faculty could apply for tri-council research funding and Professor Kraatz explained that they were not eligible to apply for CIHR funding.

5. New Undergraduate Courses Submitted Out-of-Cycle

The Chair invited Professor Gough to introduce the new undergraduate courses submitted out-ofcycle. He remarked that out-of-cycle courses were courses submitted for approval outside of the Calendar production timelines and were generally associated with courses being taught by newly hired faculty members.

Professor Mark Schmuckler, Vice-Principal, Undergraduate, reported that six new undergraduate courses were being proposed out of cycle to be taught during Fall 2016 from the Departments of: Anthropology, Historical and Cultural Studies, Human Geography, and Psychology. He added that the courses being proposed from the Department of Anthropology were Health Studies courses, which would be funded by the Undergraduate Course Development Fund (UCDF) offered to undergraduate divisions by the Provost's Office. The funding provided the delivery and instruction of undergraduate courses by a graduate faculty member from a graduate division.

A member commented that the delivery and instruction of courses via the UCDF hindered departments from looking at long term faculty complement requirements Professor Schmuckler explained that UCDF courses provided departments with insight into student interest in particular areas prior to hiring faculty members. He added that one percent of courses taught at UTSC were associated with the UCDF.

A member asked if faculty members from the graduate divisions had experience teaching undergraduate students, and Ms Annette Knott, Academic Programs Officer, explained that they did.

A member commented that UCFD courses were beneficial for departments where there was insufficient faculty to teach electives.
