Visual Studies minor

Upon completion of the Visual Studies minor students will be able to:

- 1. understand the historical, technological, and cultural significance of a range of precedents in contemporary art.
- articulate how history, technology and culture inform methodological approaches in creative practice.
- 3. interpret a variety of artistic and literary precedents, to perform a review of a technique, theory, or topic of interest.
- 4. employ practice-based research skills including creative experimentation as both a product and a process.
- 5. rationalize their selection of methods and media, i.e. describe how their selections are informed by, and support their idea.
- engage with feedback as a fundamental part of the artistic process, i.e. appraise feedback received, and participate respectfully in collaborative critique about the work of others.
- 7. read, comprehend, and interpret a variety of written styles employed in artistic practice and research.
- 8. use writing to effectively communicate their creative intentions, processes, arguments, and position.
- 9. convey their creative intentions, processes, arguments, and position through artistic expression.
- 10. engage in dialogue about their work and speak clearly about their position.
- 11. navigate the ambiguity between their expression, and the reception of their work.
- **12.** demonstrate active listening and be receptive to other ways of knowing.
- **13.** engage with emerging paradigms in contemporary art.
- **14.** maintain their autonomy and integrity whilst working effectively with others.
- 15. give examples of professionals employing creative processes and artistic expressions from a variety of sectors and roles.
- 16. foster within themselves independent motivations and approaches for exploration and production.
